Beat the lines and cast an early ballot before the General Election

You don't have to wait for November 6 to vote in the General Election. By voting early, voters can cast their ballots when it's more convenient and avoid long lines.

From October 15 to November 2, citizens can vote on most days at the main elections office in Lawrenceville. There are also seven satellite voting locations countywide where people can vote from October 20 to November 2 on most days. Visit www.gwinnettelections.com for schedules and locations and to request a mail-in absentee ballot.

To vote on Election Day, you must vote at your assigned polling location. To find your polling location or view a sample ballot, visit www.mvp.sos.ga.gov.

Recycle your used stuff at America Recycles Day

Recycle your electronics, tires, paint, ink cartridges, and more at America Recycles Day on **Saturday, November 17** from **9:00am** to **noon** at Coolray Field in Lawrenceville.

You can also bring your old sneakers and gently used clothing to be donated to those in need or to be recycled into new products. Come for free kids' activities, including touch-a-truck, the chance to meet your haulers, plus refreshments and giveaways while supplies last.

Here are some things to remember before you come: paper shredding is limited to five copier paper boxes; paint is limited to 10 gallons; tire recycling is limited to eight per vehicle, but dealer tires are not accepted; electronics recycling is free except for TVs, monitors, and printers. Commissioners approve sidewalk improvements on Pleasant Hill Road

The Board of Commissioners recently awarded a contract to make \$987,000 worth of sidewalk improvements on Pleasant Hill Road

The 1.15-mile project has two sections: Shackleford Road to Club Drive and Old Norcross Road to Satellite Boulevard. In addition to the sidewalk, the project includes landscaping, curb and gutter, and drainage structures.

Know what to do in a house fire

October is Fire Prevention Month. Survival in a house fire largely depends on knowing what to expect and what to do.

To keep your family safe and prepared for an emergency, firefighters recommend having a home fire escape plan and practicing family drills regularly.

Have at least two clear ways out of each room. Keep a multi-purpose ABC portable fire extinguisher handy. Check your smoke alarms regularly. In a fire, have a place outside where everyone knows to go. Do not go back inside.

Expect dense smoke to make it impossible to see. Carbon monoxide can knock you unconscious and be fatal within seconds. To survive, stay low, crawl to a door or a window, and get out as fast as you can.

If you are trapped upstairs, stuff a sheet or blanket under the door. Cover the HVAC vent. Cover your face with a wet towel, stay low by an open window, and signal to firefighters with a bright colored garment or other object. Call 911 and give your location inside the home.

Conserve water even when it rains and the weather cools off

Lake Lanier provides all of the drinking water in Gwinnett while the Chattahoochee River provides water for multiple municipalities. And even though it's been raining and the weather is starting to cool, water conservation remains important to preserving our water supply.

Here are a few indoor water-saving habits we can all adopt:

- Turn off the water while brushing teeth and shaving to save about four gallons a minute
- Clean your dishes with a dishwasher, which uses less water than washing by hand
- When using the washing machine or dishwasher, only run full loads
- · Shorten your showers aim for a five-minute shower
- · Check for leaks and have them repaired promptly
- When buying a water-using appliance, check the Consortium for Energy Efficiency website for the best ratings
- When cleaning your fish tank, use the nutrient-rich water to water your non-edible plants

Another way to save water: when you're waiting for your shower to warm up in the morning, place a small bucket under the faucet to catch the cool water to water household plants, fill a pet bowl, or soak the compost pile.
