Happening Around Gwinnett

Board of Commissioners proposes to hold millage rate steady

The Gwinnett Board of Commissioners is considering keeping the general millage rate fund the same as last year at 6.95 mills. While the total digest of taxable property is prepared, Georgia law requires that a rollback millage rate be computed that will produce the same total revenue on the current year's digest that last year's millage rate would have produced had no reassessments occurred. For 2024, Gwinnett's rollback millage rate is calculated at 6.5 mills. The 2024 millage rate the Board of Commissioners is considering is 6.95 mills, or .45 mills above the rollback millage rate. Therefore, state law requires commissioners to announce a property tax increase.

The BioReady® program rates communities in three tiers: Bronze, Silver and Gold. These ratings assess a municipality's readiness to host biotechnology facilities based on zoning practices and infrastructure capacity, helping real estate developers and biotechnology companies find the most favorable destinations to

locate. Gwinnett County is the first county in metro Atlanta to qualify for and receive gold status as a BioReady® Community.

Discovery Park will become the 53rd addition to the award-winning Gwinnett Parks and Recreation system. Located at the intersection of Old Norcross Road and Lawrenceville-Suwanee Road in District 1, park-goers can look forward to amenities such as a lighted multiuse trail, ball fields, an interactive fountain, and an inclusive playground for children of various ages and abilities.
