Head to the polls on Election Day

Voters can cast their ballots on Election Day, **Tuesday**, **November 5 from 7:00am to 7:00pm**. Visit the Secretary of State's <u>My Voter</u> <u>Page</u> to locate your assigned polling location or view a sample ballot. Please note that if you are in line at 7:00pm, you will be allowed to vote.

There is no voting at the Voter Registrations and Elections Beauty P. Baldwin Building on Election Day. Voted absentee ballots can be mailed or hand-delivered to the <u>Voter Registrations and Elections</u> <u>Beauty P. Baldwin Building</u>. All absentee ballots must be received in the office no later than November 5 at 7:00pm.

Election Day polling places cannot accept absentee ballots.

The General Election results will be posted online on the <u>Georgia Secretary of State's website</u>. A link to the election results will be posted on <u>GwinnettCounty.com</u> after the polls close.

Gwinnett cuts ribbon on OneStop Centerville expansion

Gwinnett officials cut the ribbon for the **newly expanded OneStop Centerville** enhancing access to services and resources for residents in the southern part of the county. Located beside the Centerville Senior Center, the expanded facility offers a variety of community spaces for events, workshops, classes, and other activities.

The 33,000-square-foot, two-story facility includes an 11,000-

square-foot playground and houses office space for County partners, including GNR Public Health and View Point Health. GNR Public Health will provide dental services, regular health center services, and an office for the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women and Children. View Point Health will debut its first Play Therapy and Resilience Training Program, providing comprehensive education, training, and clinical supervision for clinicians specializing in the care of children and families.
