Check your voter registration status before the May election

The next election in Gwinnett will be the General Primary and Nonpartisan General Election held Tuesday, May 24. <u>You must be registered to vote by April 25</u> in order to cast your ballot in this election. You can <u>check your registration status</u> on the Secretary of State's <u>My Voter Page</u>.

On February 17, Governor Kemp signed into law new district maps for the <u>Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners</u> and the <u>Gwinnett County Board of Education</u>. Eligible voters should expect to receive a new precinct card with their updated districts around April in advance of the election.

Gwinnett Youth Commission application deadline coming soon

The Gwinnett Youth Commission is yearlong program, including an eight-week summer program designed to educate youth about local government, engage youth in civic affairs, and provide an opportunity for youth to affect change in their community. Youth get behind-the-scenes tours of County government departments, interact with leaders, and receive community leadership training designed to foster the

next generation of leaders for Gwinnett County.

The next session begins June 1. The application deadline for the 2022 to 2023 cohort is Friday, April 15 at 5:00pm. Accepted Youth will be notified in early May. Apply here.





Apply for a homestead exemption by April 1

The best way to reduce your property tax bill is to apply for a homestead exemption. If you own and occupy a home in Gwinnett as your primary residence as of January 1, you likely qualify.

Apply at <u>GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Apply</u> by April 1, and staff will help determine your eligibility and the best exemption for your situation. You must apply by April 1 for relief this year. If you already have an exemption in place, you do not need to reapply.
