Free flu & COVID-19 vaccine clinic at the Centerville Library Branch

Get ready for the winter months by getting a free COVID-19 or flu vaccine on Tuesday, November 19 from noon to 4:00pm at the Centerville Branch of the Gwinnett County Public Library, located at 3025 Bethany Church Road in Snellville. While vaccines are free by showing an ID card and insurance card, there is a limited supply of free vaccines available for children under 19 with no insurance.

Tri Care, Oscar, Kaiser, and Ambetter PLUS insurances are NOT accepted. Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult to receive any vaccines. You can register for the event on the Gwinnett County Public Library website.

Apply to serve on a Gwinnett County board

Looking for a way to get more involved in your community? Serve as the District 2 appointee on the Gwinnett County Stormwater Authority, the Gwinnett County Human Services Advisory Board, or the Family and Children Services Board.

The Stormwater Authority consists of seven members who either have scientific training or have demonstrated experience with stormwater issues. Members serve four year terms.

The Gwinnett County Human Services Advisory Board ensures coordination and collaboration among participating entities in the Countywide human services ecosystem. The board is composed of 21 members, who are either Gwinnett County residents or work in a human services field in Gwinnett County, and the Community Services Department Director. Members serve two year terms.

The Family and Children Services Board protects the well-being of this state's children while preserving family integrity. The board consists of seven members, with members serving five-year terms.

Practice food safety this holiday season

Whether you're cooking festive feasts indoors or grilling outdoors, it's essential to keep food safety in mind to avoid food poisoning and

foodborne illnesses. Follow these tips to ensure your gatherings are memorable for all the right reasons:

- Don't buy cans with dents, bulges, or rust.
- Set refrigeration between 35°F and 40°F; freezers should be at or below 0°F.
- Don't roast meat or poultry at temperatures below 325°F.
 Cooking foods at low temperatures for long periods of time may encourage bacterial growth.
