

Probate Court Organizational Chart






Weapons Carry License Applications January – July







Due to the success of the Pro Bono Clinic, it is now being hosted twice monthly on the first and third Thursday.






Monitors were installed outside the Licensing and Vital Records office to provide important information to the citizens visiting GJAC.













Looking ahead to better serve the citizens of Gwinnett County
