





- Expand transportation infrastructure through technology and energy efficiencies














New Operational Requests

- 1 Traffic Engineer and 1 Traffic Analyst \$275,438




New Operational Request Supporting Information

- 487 centerline miles of roadways in Maintenance District 5
- 1,485 shoulder miles mowed each year
- 922 service requests in 2023











New Operational Request Supporting Information
