Food safety is always a priority, especially during the bustling holiday season! Whether you're whipping up festive feasts indoors or grilling outdoors, it's essential to keep food safety in mind to avoid food poisoning and foodborne illnesses. Follow these tips to ensure your gatherings are memorable for all the right reasons:

- Safety at the supermarket: Don't buy cans with dents, bulges, or rust
- Store it right: Set refrigeration between 35°F and 40°F; freezers should be at or below 0°F



• Cooking to perfection: Don't roast meat or poultry at temperatures below 325°F. Cooking foods at low temperatures for long periods of time may encourage bacterial growth

Heat your home safely this holiday season

As colder months approach, the threat of wintry weather looms. We want to emphasize the importance of safety while heating your home with alternate heating methods if power outages become a concern. Here's a list of essential tips to help you stay safe and warm this winter:

- Fireplaces need to be cleaned out frequently, and chimneys should be inspected for obstructions and cracks to prevent deadly chimney and roof fires
- Only buy space and kerosene heaters evaluated by a nationally recognized laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories or UL
- Never use generators in homes, garages, basements, crawl spaces, or other enclosed or partially enclosed areas, even with ventilation
