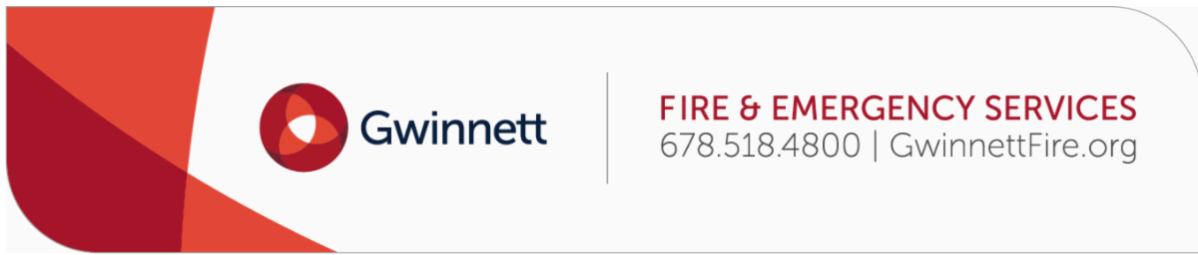
Outside for some summer fun? Stay alert!
