

## **Quarterly Safety Tips**

## Prepare your home for cold weather

Heating is the second leading cause of U.S. home fires, deaths, and injuries. December, January, and February are the peak months for heating fires. Here are some helpful tips to ensure you're staying safe this winter while also keeping warm:

- Keep children, pets, and anything flammable at least three feet away from heating equipment like furnaces, fireplaces, or space heaters.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys professionally cleaned and inspected annually.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month.





Red doesn't just represent Gwinnett Fire and Emergency Services! It's also worn in honor of American Heart Month, which is celebrated every February.

Heart disease is still the leading cause of death in the United States according to the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute. Here are some ways to get involved during American Heart Month:

- Eat healthy: Enjoy a variety of fruits and vegetables, whole grains, and low-fat or fat-free dairy products. Refrain from foods that are high in sugar and saturated fat and cut back on alcohol consumption.
- Talk with your doctor: Schedule an appointment with your medical professional to help understand any heart-related concerns.
- Learn CPR and how to use an AED: <u>Take one of our CPR classes</u> to learn how to perform CPR and use an AED.

Join us to learn vital lessons that could help prevent a fire or save a life, including CPR/AED, portable fire extinguisher use, EMS operations, and more. There will also be demonstrations from our specialty team units





including Swiftwater, Hazmat, Mass Casualty, and Technical Rescue (trench collapse, confined space, high-angle rope rescue), and Georgia Search and Rescue Technicians.

"It's a 'behind-the-scenes' on what firefighters do," said Gwinnett Fire Educator Jaclyn Roberson. "They get to meet all the specialty teams and see their equipment. There are nights where they do different simulated drills like our firefighters."

Spring classes will be held from **April 17 to June 12**, while fall classes will be scheduled from **September 11 to November 6**. All classes will be held on Thursdays from **6:00pm to 9:00pm**.
