## Participate in Gwinnett Fire and Emergency Services' Hiring Event



Join us at our upcoming Gwinnett Firefighter/Paramedic Trainee Hiring Event on **Tuesday, May 28 from 9:00am to 3:00pm** at 3608 Braselton Highway in Dacula. This is a unique opportunity to complete a substantial portion of the first phase of a two-phase hiring process. Participants can complete an orientation, a more detailed application, a background check, physical testing, and an oral interview. Please note that sneakers and long pants are required for the physical testing.

The entire process typically takes two to three hours, although it may take longer. We highly recommend

submitting an application at GwinnettFireJobs.com before attending the event.

## Get your rental home inspected



Gwinnett County is committed to upholding the interior standards of the International Property Maintenance Code at residential rental properties. If your rental home is damaged, improperly maintained, unsanitary, or unsafe, you may request an inspection by emailing <a href="mailto:CodeEnforcement@GwinnettCounty.com">CodeEnforcement@GwinnettCounty.com</a>, visiting <a href="mailto:GwinnettZIP.com">GwinnettZIP.com</a>, or calling 770.513.5004.

Once a request is submitted, an inspection appointment will be scheduled. During the inspection, any code violations will be documented on a notice of violation. A Gwinnett Code Enforcement officer will then work with the
