What's new on TV Gwinnett?

Gwinnett County brings you the latest news and happenings about your community through TV Gwinnett.



Gwinnett's Transit Plan includes up to 75 proposed transit projects — including the expansion of Ride Gwinnett's curb-to-curb microtransit service and a direct airport ride to Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport. These proposed transit projects require funding to be implemented, which voters will decide on through a transit referendum in the November 5 General Election. The referendum proposes a one-percent sales tax for 30 years to fund these transit projects.

Gwinnett residents tapped to shape county spending for 2025

A team of residents will weigh in on County government priorities before Gwinnett County Chairwoman Nicole Love Hendrickson proposes the 2025 budget. Gwinnett County department directors and elected officials began presenting their 2025 business plans to a Citizen Budget Review Team on August 26. Following the series of presentations, Chairwoman Hendrickson and the group will evaluate the needs of the departments and agencies that provide services to Gwinnett residents, businesses, and visitors. From there, the team will recommend funding priorities from the viewpoint of a resident.



On-demand videos of the budget presentations will be available on the County's website following each day's presentations. The business plans will also be available on the County's government access channel TV Gwinnett.

Commissioner Ku to host State of District 2 on August 29

Join <u>District 2 Commissioner Ben Ku</u> for a town hall to discuss District 2 projects and countywide updates. The town hall will take place **Thursday, August 29 from 6:00pm to 7:00pm**at the Mountain Park Activity Building, located at **1063 Rockbridge Road in Stone Mountain**.



Commissioner Ku will share the latest developments in District 2, followed by a Q&A session with County representatives. An ASL translator will be available during the Q&A portion of the meeting.

Nonprofit Capacity Building Grant applications open until August 30

The County will accept applications for its Nonprofit Capacity Building Grant until August 30. The grant program provides financial assistance to nonprofits negatively affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. This may occur in the form of operational support or capital support. Applications can be accessed in the grant application portal, and applicants must register with GovGrants to submit an application.

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners allocated \$5 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding for Nonprofit Capacity Building. In alignment with the County's <u>Human Services Strategic Plan</u>, funding will be awarded to organizations providing services in



food security, housing, health and wellness, youth, literacy, and learning, and cross-cutting barriers to access like transportation or culturally and linguistically responsive services.

Attend the County's annual Public Safety Fall Festival

Come out from **10:00am to 2:00pm** to meet our first responders and enjoy food, giveaways, demonstrations, and displays. Gwinnett residents are invited to <u>drop off glass and paper for recycling</u> across four days in September, rain or shine, from **11:00am to 1:00pm** each day:

- Tuesday, September 10 at Peachtree Ridge Park, 3170
 Suwanee Creek Road in Suwanee
- Wednesday, September 11 at Lucky Shoals Park, 4651 Britt Road in Norcross
- Thursday, September 12 at Lenora Park, 4500 Lenora Church Road in Snellville

Gwinnett businesses can apply for Incumbent Worker Training program

The Atlanta Regional Workforce Development Board is <u>seeking</u> <u>applications</u> from Gwinnett County businesses to participate in the Incumbent Worker Training program. The federally funded program is available to businesses with five or more employees operating for



at least one year in the seven-county area, including Gwinnett.

The program provides a maximum of \$25,000 per employer and \$7,000 per participant yearly to provide tailored training solutions. Employers are required to contribute 50 percent of the total training costs. Awards will be granted on a competitive basis. Learn more about the Incumbent Worker Training program and how to apply.

What to expect when sewer maintenance is in your neighborhood

Gwinnett Water Resources maintains thousands of miles of sewer pipe running underground from homes and businesses to water reclamation facilities. Over time, these pipes can accumulate debris, requiring maintenance. When the County performs maintenance on the public sewer system, it is generally unnoticeable but there are some things to be aware of:

- Maintenance usually takes less than a few hours.
- There may be loud noises associated with the maintenance.
- Toilets may gurgle or splash and p-traps may empty.



If you have sewer maintenance in your neighborhood, close your toilet lids and be sure to flush when the trucks leave. If you have questions about maintenance activities in your neighborhood, you can call Water Resources' 24-hour dispatch at 678.376.7000.
