County completes purchase of Macy's properties at Gwinnett Place Mall

The Urban Redevelopment Agency of Gwinnett County finalized the \$16.5 million purchase of the 23-acre Macy's department and furniture store properties at Gwinnett Place Mall, marking a key advancement in the redevelopment of the site. The eventual redevelopment will transform the mall site into a bustling, mixeduse complex and is projected to bring both catalytic change and new opportunities to Gwinnett residents and businesses. With this acquisition, the Urban Redevelopment Agency and Gwinnett County own a combined total of 76 acres on the Gwinnett Place Mall site.



Gwinnett County is partnering with CBRE, a real estate services firm with global expertise, to advance and refine plans for the redevelopment. The County plans to begin its selection process for a development partner with the nationwide release of a request for proposals in the first quarter of 2025. The Macy's department and furniture stores will be leased back to Macy's for continued operations through early 2025. Stay up to date on the <u>Gwinnett</u> <u>Place Mall redevelopment</u>.

Adoptions and intakes paused through December 19

The Bill Atkinson Animal Welfare Center will be closed until **December 19** to prevent the spread of Streptococcus Zooepidemicus, known as Strep Zoo. During this time, Gwinnett Animal Welfare and Enforcement will continue to process pet reclaims. The center will also continue to intake sick, injured, or



aggressive animals for the safety of the community.

Strep Zoo is a zoonotic disease, meaning it can transfer between animals and humans, although human cases are very rare and associated with other underlying diseases or immunosuppression. Symptoms in dogs are severe respiratory distress, nasal discharge, vomiting, and rapid decline in health within 24 to 48 hours. Pet owners should monitor pets carefully for symptoms and seek immediate veterinary attention if symptoms arise. Without timely intervention, it can be fatal. Treatment with antibiotics is effective since it is a bacterial infection. Early diagnosis is key. For updates, follow us on Facebook @GwinnettAnimalShelter.

Keep the cheer, skip the Christmas tree fires

For many families, holiday preparations start with decorating, but it's easy to overlook potential fire hazards. Almost one-third of home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems. Keep your family safe this holiday season with these safety tips:

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched
- Position the tree at least three feet away from any heat source
- Replace any worn or broken light strings and loose bulb connections
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree
