Dog adoptions and intakes paused through January 2

The Bill Atkinson Animal Welfare Center is pausing adoptions and intakes for dogs and puppies through **Thursday**, **January 2** to prevent the spread of Streptococcus Zooepidemicus, known as Strep Zoo. During this time, Gwinnett Animal Welfare and Enforcement will continue to process pet reclaims. The center will also continue cat and kitten adoptions and intakes, as well as intake sick, injured, or aggressive animals for the safety of the community.

Strep Zoo is a zoonotic disease, meaning it can transfer between animals and humans, although human cases are very rare and associated with other underlying diseases or immunosuppression. Symptoms in dogs are severe respiratory distress, nasal discharge.



vomiting, and rapid decline in health within 24 to 48 hours. Pet owners should monitor pets carefully for symptoms and seek immediate veterinary attention if symptoms arise. Without timely intervention, it can be fatal. Treatment with antibiotics is effective since it is a bacterial infection. Early diagnosis is key. Visit the new Western Gwinnett Pathway



Gwinnett officials recently unveiled a new segment of the Western Gwinnett Pathway, spanning five miles between Rogers Bridge Road and Suwanee Dam Road. As a part of the 2018 Gwinnett Countywide Trails Master Plan, the pathway — with the vision to connect the Loop Trail — will extend 17 miles, connecting Shorty Howell Park, the Gwinnett Place Mall area, the Gas South District, and the cities of Duluth and Suwanee.

Approximately \$7 million of the total \$14 million project was funded by the County's SPLOST program.
