





# Capital Support \$4,550,000

Administration: Grants Management Division

**Program Timeline:** 12 months

Award Value(s): \$3,000 to \$100,000 (one award per NPO)

Payment Terms: Advance funding upon receipt of PO/Contract for capital purchase.

Reporting Requirements: Impact Reporting



# Operational Support \$450,000

**Administration:** Grants Management Division & NPO Trainers

**Program Timeline:** 15 months

Award Value(s): \$40,000 (10 participating NPOs)

Payment Terms: Quarterly installments of \$10,000

Reporting Requirements: Capacity Building Project Report

### Capital Support

- Nonprofits with 12 months of operation
- Demonstrated history of serving Gwinnett residents
- Experienced negative economic impact due to COVID-19
- Active participation in Unite Us

### **Operational Support**



- All requirements under Capital Support
- Annual operating budget equal to, or less than, \$250,000
- Commitment to participation in all program components



### Goals

Increase nonprofit effectiveness

Identify NPOs with limited capacity but impactful results

Enhance organizational capacity

Facilitate nonprofit workshops and technical assistance

Foster sustainability

Encourage collaboration
