









OPC GENERATION FACILITIES





JACKSON GENERATION MIX









Plant Vogtle

- Jackson EMC invested
 \$2.2 billion in Units 3
 and 4 of Plant Vogtle.
- Largest carbon-free generation plant in the United States.


By 2025, our emissions rate will be reduced by 51% from our 2007 level.



- * **2022:** Our replacement of coal with natural gas has driven down this number. Natural gas is a cleaner burning fuel and natural gas plants are more efficient.
- ** **2025:** Vogtle 3 and 4 will continue to drive reduced emissions further as it replaces purchases of natural gas with zero emission energy.


